### **Overview of Covid-19 State Tax Issues**

- In response to the pandemic, state and local governments are using various strategies to provide relief to businesses and individuals
  - Tax legislation
  - Tax guidance
  - Executive Orders
- Federal return filing and payment deadlines have been extended to July 15<sup>th</sup>
  - Some states have conformed
  - Some states have chosen other deadlines
  - Some states conform only for certain kinds of taxpayers

### **Overview of Covid-19 State Tax Issues**

- States are also taking action with regards to taxes other than income taxes
  - Extending deadlines
  - Providing relief from penalties and interest
- There are a number of moving parts to consider
  - Do teleworking employees create new nexus for your company?
    - New Jersey this week announced it is waiving the nexus thresholds for employees working from home
- State tax impact of the federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act
  - The Act provides a temporary relaxation of rules limiting the business interest expense deduction
  - Temporary relaxation of rules limiting NOLs
  - Relaxation of excess business loss rules
  - Refundable employee retention credits, among other things
