MS. GABLE: Good morning, Your Honor. Colleen
Curtin Gable and Matthew Powers appearing on behalf of
the People. The next matter before the Court is the
matter of Harvey Weinstein regarding a request for
temporary custody pursuant to the Interstate Agreement on
Detainers by the state of California, specifically, the
Los Angeles District Attorney. The defendant Harvey
Weinstein appears virtually and his attorney Norman
Effman appears live in court.

And, Your Honor, before we get to any of the substantive issues, I believe that the Court needs to address the procedure.

THE COURT: All right. Thank you. Good morning, Mr. Weinstein.

THE DEFENDANT: Good morning.

THE COURT: My name's Ken Case. I'm an Erie County Court Judge. I'll be presiding over this matter. As was just stated by the assistant district attorney, the People and your attorney Mr. Effman are appearing in court but, sir, you are appearing remotely from the Wende Correctional Facility, and this matter is being recorded. Have you had an opportunity to speak privately with your attorney about appearing remotely for today's proceeding?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, I did.

THE COURT: All right. And do you consent to

appearing remotely, sir, for this proceeding today? THE DEFENDANT: Yes, I do.

THE COURT: All right. And you have a right to speak privately with your attorney at any point during this proceeding. If you wish to speak to him, just let me know and we can make those arrangements, all right?

Thank you, Your Honor.

THE COURT: All right Ms. Curtin Gable.

MS. GABLE: Your Honor, just for the record, arrangements had been made for an in-person appearance by this defendant. After those arrangements were made, it was brought to our attention that he would consent to appear virtually, but I just wanted the record to be clear that had he insisted on coming in person, we would have been able to accommodate that.

MR. EFFMAN: We would acknowledge that, Your

Thank you, Mr. Effman.

Your Honor, it's my understanding that an agreement has been reached between defendant, his counsel and the Los Angeles County District Attorney's office that today's proceedings would be stayed or continued until December 11th of this year. That in essence what we were prepared to do today will happen for a variety of reasons on December 11th instead.

Effman has something to say about that, obviously he gets the opportunity, and then there are a series of questions that we would ask this Court to address to the defendant.

MR. EFFMAN: Initially, Your Honor, before we get into that, I would ask the Court to review the video process because my understanding is that there is a live stream to some media outlets that have access to a separate and distinct Skype-type review of this and I think there are some limitations as to what they can do with that. I would ask the Court to advise them as to those limitations.

THE COURT: Thank you for reminding me. So the folks who are viewing this through a live stream, there is to be no restreaming, recording or photographing of the procedures and I know that order was already conveyed to you. Obviously that's different for folks who happen to be in the courtroom, but I did want to bring that up, and I thank you for bringing that to my attention.

MR. EFFMAN: Thank you, Your Honor. With respect to the stipulation, what has happened in the past twenty-four hours is that we, Mr. Weinstein's attorneys, have been in touch with the Los Angeles County District Attorney's office with respect to their request for temporary custody and the issues that would come out under normal circumstances regarding that request in

today's world. In any event, a stipulation was reached I would guess about 9:00 o'clock our time last night and the stipulation was transferred electronically to the Erie County D.A.'s office. I've reviewed the stipulation, I've reviewed it with Mr. Weinstein, and we are prepared to go forward with that.

My basic understanding is that the stipulation will in a sense begin the process of the Interstate

Agreement on Detainers on December 11th. And my

understanding, at least my reading of the statute

indicates that on that date that there's no waiver of

extradition because Mr. Weinstein is not giving up any of

his rights at this point, that we can address the issue

to the governor who would then have thirty days to either

do nothing, deny the request or grant it.

MS. GABLE: And my understanding, Your Honor, is that there is some variations on when that thirty days start, whether it is the date that we are first in court or the date that the defendant is served, but I don't think that's going to be a major hurtle here. I'm just not conceding that that's when the thirty days starts, but I don't think that's going to be an issue.

THE COURT: All right. Just in light of the circumstances and the current pandemic and so forth, why don't we say that the thirty day period will begin then

1 at our December 11th arraignment date, and just so 2 everybody's on the same page, and of course 3 MR. EFFMAN: That is my request, Your Honor, and I thank you. 5 THE COURT: Okay. Granted. Anything else I 6 need to cover? MS. GABLE: Just the stipulation as counsel 8 referred to or the series of questions that the LA County 9 D.A.'s office is asking to be addressed to this 10 defendant. THE COURT: All right. So Mr. Weinstein, we are 11 12 moving this proceeding, adjourning it from today until 13 December 11th at 9:30. Again, for simplicity I guess I'll keep the case, so it will be in County Court Part 7. 14 15 But I just want to run through a couple of 16 things with you. Let me know if you're having any 17 difficulty hearing me, all right? 18 THE DEFENDANT: I can hear you, Your Honor. 19 Thank you. Sir, you have a THE COURT: Great 20 right to a speedy trial under the Sixth Amendment of the U.S. Constitution, and you understand that, sir? 21 22 THE DEFENDANT: Yes, I do 23 THE COURT: All right. Do you give up this 24 right for purposes of continuing today's extradition proceeding only and continuing the hearing until December 25

11th of this year?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, I do

THE COURT: All right. Have you been advised by your counsel of your right to be brought to trial within one hundred and twenty days of your arrival in Los

Angeles pursuant to Article 4 of the Interstate Agreement on Detainers?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, I have.

THE COURT: All right. And do you consent to a continuance of today's hearing until December 11th, 2020 thereby delaying your return to Los Angeles?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, Your Honor

THE COURT: Thank you. Anything further from the People?

MS. GABLE: I guess the only thing is closer to that date we will see what posture we're in in the courts, whether we are still doing things virtually, which we can all hope we are not in that position any more, and I'll be contact with counsel and the Court regarding how the proceeding is going to proceed.

MR. EFFMAN: Judge, I don't know whether it makes any sense to set a status date sometime before the 11th, but I leave that to the Court's discretion.

Certainly I would be available for any type of conference to discuss where we are at that point.

1 THE COURT: So we'll plan on the 11th for now, 2 but feel free to contact me. We can have a conference call or an in-person pretrial prior to that date. I'll 3 certainly make myself available. 5 MS. GABLE: Great. Thank you, Your Honor. 6 MR. EFFMAN: Thank you. 7 THE COURT: Thank you. 8 Thank you, Mr. Weinstein. MR. EFFMAN: 9 care. 10 THE DEFENDANT: Thank you, sir. 11 12 CERTIFICATE 13 I, Lynn M.
