ORDER

Upon consideration of Defendant's Motion to Modify Conditions of Release to Permit Travel Outside of the Jurisdiction of Supervision (ECF No. 213) it is hereby:

ORDERED that the Defendant's Motion is **GRANTED** in part and **DENIED** in part; and it is further

ORDERED that Ms. Baylor is permitted to travel to and from her current jurisdiction of supervision to Los Angeles, California from Tuesday, November 17, 2020 through Tuesday, November 24, 2020, for work related purposes, based upon the schedule provided in Exhibit B of Defendant's Motion. As a result of this travel, eight days shall be added to Ms. Baylor's Home Detention period, meaning this period shall now conclude on January 21, 2021; it is further

ORDERED that Ms. Baylor shall not be placed on GPS monitoring during the period of time she will be outside the jurisdiction of her current supervision for work, given the Probation Office's policy of reserving this technology for high risk or technologically challenged geographic areas, the Probation Office's inability to switch monitoring technology on such short notice, and the Covid-19 safety risks that would attach to the required in-person meetings to update Ms. Baylor's monitoring technology.
