ORDERED that the Bureau of Prisons (BOP) immediately place the defendant in a 14day quarantine to ensure that he is not infected with the COVID-19 virus and upon completion of the 14-day quarantine release the defendant into the custody of Teri Huber, who must promptly transport the defendant to her home, and it is further

The Clerk is directed to forward copies of this Order to counsel of record, the United

States Marshals Service, and United States Probation Officer Michelle M. Suleiman.
