The essential need for further relief

President-elect Joe Biden Vice President-elect Kamala Harris

Dear President-elect Biden and Vice President-elect Harris:

Right now someone dies in this country every 30 seconds from COVID and it will be months before most Americans have access to a vaccine. We are also experiencing the worst economic crisis since the Great Depression, with tens of millions either unemployed, out of the labor force, or experiencing a decline in hours and pay since March, and millions facing eviction and food insecurity. There's been no aid since March for our cash-strapped states and local communities, no money to pay for essential services we rely on for recovery.

Given the horrific extent of the escalating crisis and the desperation that working families all over this country are experiencing, the congressional relief package just passed does not go anywhere near far enough in providing relief to people across the country. A one-time \$600 check and eleven weeks of unemployment benefits won't last families and small businesses long or make up for the months without support as families waited for the deal to be struck. And particularly for Black and Brown families that have been hit hardest by the virus and the recession, it is only a down payment on the shovel to start digging them out of the hole. We need a robust COVID-19 relief package to meet the immediate crisis and a large stimulus package to fix the pandemic economy.

We must be clear that the band-aid passed in December was just the beginning and your administration and the next Congress will need to do much more. To truly build back better, we need fully expanded unemployment insurance and recurring direct stimulus payments that include immigrant families and adult dependents, both lasting until the economy recovers. We need to expedite aid to our states, cities, towns and tribal lands to protect essential jobs and services and prevent another massive wave of layoffs. America cannot recover without health care assistance, an eviction moratorium and cancellation of rent & mortgages, paid family and medical leave, and many other supports.

People who can barely make ends meet and are going without food, medicines and electricity cannot afford to be held hostage to political games in Washington or partisan gridlock. They need steady and regular relief, tied to economic conditions.

The need is urgent. The response must be bold. We urge your leadership and pledge our own efforts to pass a relief bill in the first days of your administration that is truly at the scale of the crisis, to combat the virus and build an economy that works for everyone. Thank you.
