# A BILL

Making emergency supplemental appropriations to respond to the attacks in Israel for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 That the following sums are appropriated, out of any

4 money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, for the

- 5 fiscal year ending September 30, 2024, and for other pur-
- 6 poses, namely:

2	DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE
3	OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE
4	OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE, DEFENSE-WIDE
5	(INCLUDING TRANSFER OF FUNDS)
6	For an additional amount for "Operation and Main-
7	tenance, Defense-Wide", \$4,400,000,000, to remain avail-
8	able until September 30, 2025, to respond to the attacks
9	in Israel: <i>Provided</i> , That such amounts may be transferred
10	to accounts under the headings "Operation and Mainte-
11	nance" and "Procurement" for replacement of defense ar-
12	ticles from the stocks of the Department of Defense, and
13	for reimbursement for defense services of the Department
14	of Defense and military education and training, provided
15	to Israel or identified and notified to Congress for provi-
16	sion to Israel: Provided further, That funds transferred
17	pursuant to the previous proviso shall be merged with and
18	available for the same purposes and for the same time pe-
19	riod as the appropriations to which the funds are trans-
20	ferred: Provided further, That the Secretary of Defense
21	shall notify the congressional defense committees of the
22	details of such transfers not less than 15 days before any
23	such transfer: Provided further, That upon a determina-
24	tion that all or part of the funds transferred from this
25	appropriation are not necessary for the purposes provided

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under this heading, such amounts may be transferred back 1 and merged with this appropriation: *Provided further*, 2 3 That any transfer authority provided under this heading 4 is in addition to any other transfer authority provided by 5 law: *Provided further*, That such amount is designated by the Congress as an emergency requirement pursuant to 6 7 section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and 8 Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended.

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#### PROCUREMENT

10 PROCUREMENT OF AMMUNITION, ARMY

For an additional amount for "Procurement of Ammunition, Army", \$801,400,000, to remain available until
September 30, 2026, to respond to the attacks in Israel: *Provided*, That such amount is designated by the Congress
as an emergency requirement pursuant to section
251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended.

18 WEAPONS PROCUREMENT, NAVY

For an additional amount for "Weapons Procurement, Navy", \$10,000,000, to remain available until September 30, 2026, to respond to the attacks in Israel: *Pro- vided*, That such amount is designated by the Congress
as an emergency requirement pursuant to section
251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended.

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MISSILE PROCUREMENT, AIR FORCE

For an additional amount for "Missile Procurement, Air Force", \$38,600,000, to remain available until September 30, 2026, to respond to the attacks in Israel: *Provided*, That such amount is designated by the Congress as an emergency requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Beficit Control Act of 1985, as amended.

## 9 PROCUREMENT, DEFENSE-WIDE

10 For an additional amount for "Procurement, Defense-Wide", \$4,000,000,000, to remain available until 11 12 September 30, 2026, for the Secretary of Defense to provide to the Government of Israel for the procurement of 13 the Iron Dome and David's Sling defense systems to 14 15 counter short-range rocket threats: *Provided*, That such funds shall be transferred pursuant to an exchange of let-16 ters and are in addition to funds provided pursuant to the 17 18 U.S.-Israel Iron Dome Procurement Agreement, as amended: Provided further, That nothing under this head-19 ing shall be construed to apply to amounts made available 20 21 in prior appropriations Acts for the procurement of the 22 Iron Dome and David's Sling defense systems: Provided *further*, That such amount is designated by the Congress 23 24 as an emergency requirement pursuant to section

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251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency

2 Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended. RESEARCH, DEVELOPMENT, TEST AND 3 4 EVALUATION 5 RESEARCH, DEVELOPMENT, TEST AND EVALUATION, 6 **DEFENSE-WIDE** 7 (INCLUDING TRANSFERS OF FUNDS) 8 For an additional amount for "Research, Develop-9 ment, Test and Evaluation, Defense-Wide", 10 \$1,350,000,000, to remain available until September 30, 2025, to respond to the attacks in Israel, of which 11 12 \$1,200,000,000 shall be for the Secretary of Defense to 13 provide to the Government of Israel for the development of the Iron Beam defense system to counter short-range 14 15 rocket threats: *Provided*, That such funds shall be transferred pursuant to an exchange of letters: Provided fur-16 ther, That nothing in the preceding proviso shall be con-17 strued to apply to amounts made available in prior appro-18 priations Acts for the development of the Iron Beam de-19 fense system: Provided further, That such amounts may 20 21 be transferred to "Procurement, Defense-Wide" for the 22 production of such system: Provided further, That the Sec-23 retary of Defense shall notify the congressional defense 24 committees of the details of such transfers not less than 25 15 days before any such transfer: *Provided further*, That L:\XML\ISRAELFINAL.XML

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upon a determination that all or part of the funds trans-1 ferred from this appropriation are not necessary for the 2 3 purposes provided under this heading, such amounts may 4 be transferred back and merged with this appropriation: *Provided further*, That any transfer authority provided 5 under this heading is in addition to any other transfer au-6 7 thority provided by law: *Provided further*, That such 8 amount is designated by the Congress as an emergency 9 requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the 10 Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 11 1985, as amended.

#### 12 GENERAL PROVISIONS—THIS TITLE

13 SEC. 101. Section 12001 of the Department of De-14 fense Appropriations Act, 2005 (Public Law 108–287), as 15 amended by Public Law 115–141, is amended as follows: 16 (1) In paragraph (2) of subsection (a), by strik-17 ing "armor" and all that follows through the end of 18 the paragraph and inserting "defense articles that 19 are in the inventory of the Department of Defense 20 as of the date of transfer, are intended for use as 21 reserve stocks for Israel, and are located in a stock-22 pile for Israel as of the date of transfer";

(2) In subsection (b), by striking "at leastequal to the fair market value of the items trans-

ferred" and inserting "in an amount to be deter mined by the Secretary of Defense"; and

3 (3) In subsection (c), by striking "30" and in4 serting "15", and by inserting "Appropriations,"
5 after "Committees on" in both places it occurs.

6 SEC. 102. During fiscal year 2024, section 514(b) of
7 the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2321h(b))
8 shall not apply to defense articles to be set aside, ear9 marked, reserved, or intended for use as reserve stocks
10 in stockpiles in the State of Israel.

11 SEC. 103. Not later than 30 days after the date of 12 enactment of this Act, and every 30 days thereafter 13 through fiscal year 2025, the Secretary of Defense, in coordination with the Secretary of State, shall provide a 14 15 written report to the Committees on Appropriations, Armed Services, and Foreign Affairs of the House of Rep-16 17 resentatives and the Committees on Appropriations, 18 Armed Services, and Foreign Relations of the Senate de-19 scribing United States security assistance provided to Israel since the October 7, 2023, terrorist attack on Israel, 2021 including a comprehensive list of the defense articles and 22 services provided to Israel and the associated authority 23 and funding used to provide such articles and services: 24 *Provided*, That such report shall be submitted in unclassi-25 fied form, but may be accompanied by a classified annex.

1 SEC. 104. Concurrent with any notification of assist-2 ance made pursuant to section 506(b)(1) of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2318(b)(1)), the Sec-3 4 retary of Defense shall submit a written notification to 5 the congressional defense committees that contains a description of the defense articles and defense services to 6 7 be furnished, including the quantity, approximate value, 8 and an estimate of the cost to replace such article or an 9 equivalent capability; and a timeline for the delivery of such defense articles and defense services. 10 11 TITLE II 12 DEPARTMENT OF STATE AND RELATED AGENCY 13 14 DEPARTMENT OF STATE 15 Administration of Foreign Affairs 16 DIPLOMATIC PROGRAMS 17 For an additional amount for "Diplomatic Programs", \$150,000,000, to remain available until Sep-18 19 tember 30, 2025, for responding to the attacks in Israel 20and areas impacted by the attacks in Israel, including for 21 crisis response and relocation support for Mission Israel, 22 of which \$100,000,000 shall be available until expended 23 for Worldwide Security Protection to sustain requirements for Mission Israel and other United States missions af-24 fected by the attacks in Israel: Provided, That such 25

amount is designated by the Congress as an emergency
 requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the
 Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of
 1985, as amended.

## 5 EMERGENCIES IN THE DIPLOMATIC AND CONSULAR

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#### SERVICE

7 For an additional amount for "Emergencies in the 8 Diplomatic and Consular Service", \$50,000,000, to re-9 main available until September 30, 2025, for emergency 10 evacuation of United States Government personnel and citizens in Israel and in countries in the region impacted 11 by the attacks in Israel: *Provided*, That such amount is 12 13 designated by the Congress as an emergency requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budg-14 15 et and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended. 16

## 17 INTERNATIONAL SECURITY ASSISTANCE

18 FUNDS APPROPRIATED TO THE PRESIDENT

19 FOREIGN MILITARY FINANCING PROGRAM

For an additional amount for "Foreign Military Financing Program", \$3,500,000,000, to remain available until September 30, 2025, to respond to the attacks in Israel: *Provided*, That funds made available under this heading in this Act and prior Acts making appropriations for the Department of State, foreign operations, and reL:\XML\ISRAELFINAL.XML

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lated programs for fiscal year 2024, in addition to funds 1 otherwise available for such purposes, may be used by the 2 3 Department of State for necessary expenses for the gen-4 eral costs of administering military assistance and sales, 5 including management and oversight of such programs and activities: *Provided further*, That, to the extent that 6 7 the Government of Israel requests that funds be used for 8 such purposes, grants made available for Israel under this 9 heading shall, as agreed by the United States and Israel, 10 be available for advanced weapons systems, of which up to \$3,500,000,000 may be available for the procurement 11 in Israel of defense articles and defense services: *Provided* 12 *further*, That any congressional notification requirement 13 applicable to funds made available under this heading for 14 15 Israel may be waived if a determination is made that extraordinary circumstances exist that impact the national 16 17 security of the United States: *Provided further*, That such 18 amount is designated by the Congress as an emergency 19 requirement pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 201985, as amended. 21

## 22 GENERAL PROVISIONS—THIS TITLE

SEC. 201. (a) During fiscal year 2024, and subject
to subsection (b), section 506(a)(1) of the Foreign Assist-

ance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2318(a)(1)) shall be applied
 by substituting "\$2,500,000,000" for "\$100,000,000".

3 (b) Subsection (a) shall not take effect unless the 4 Secretary of State determines and reports to the appro-5 priate congressional committees that the exercise of the 6 authority of such subsection is necessary to respond to the 7 situation in Israel.

8 SEC. 202. Not later than 30 days after the date of 9 enactment of this Act, the Secretary of State shall submit 10 to the Committees on Appropriations a report on the proposed uses of funds appropriated by this title to respond 11 to the situation in Israel: *Provided*, That such report shall 12 13 be updated and submitted to such Committees every 60 days thereafter until September 30, 2025, and every 180 14 15 days thereafter until all funds have been expended, and shall include information detailing how estimates and as-16 sumptions contained in previous reports have changed, in-17 18 cluding obligations and expenditures.

- 19 TITLE III
- 20 GENERAL PROVISIONS—THIS ACT

SEC. 301. Each amount appropriated or made available by this Act is in addition to amounts otherwise appropriated for the fiscal year involved.

SEC. 302. No part of any appropriation contained in
 this Act shall remain available for obligation beyond the
 current fiscal year unless expressly so provided herein.

4 SEC. 303. Unless otherwise provided for by this Act,
5 the additional amounts appropriated by this Act to appro6 priations accounts shall be available under the authorities
7 and conditions applicable to such appropriations accounts
8 for fiscal year 2024.

9 SEC. 304. Each amount designated in this Act by the 10 Congress as an emergency requirement pursuant to sec-11 tion 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budget and Emer-12 gency Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended, shall be 13 available (or rescinded or transferred, if applicable) only 14 if the President subsequently so designates all such 15 amounts and transmits such designations to the Congress.

16 SEC. 305. Any amount appropriated by this Act, des-17 ignated by the Congress as an emergency requirement 18 pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Balanced Budg-19 et and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amend-20 ed, and subsequently so designated by the President, and 21 transferred pursuant to transfer authorities provided by 22 this Act shall retain such designation.

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#### BUDGETARY OFFSETS

24 SEC. 306. (a) RESCISSION OF CERTAIN BALANCES25 MADE AVAILABLE TO THE INTERNAL REVENUE SERV-

ICE.—Of the unobligated balances of amounts appro-

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priated or otherwise made available for activities of the 1 Internal Revenue Service by paragraphs 2 (1)(A)(ii),3 (1)(A)(iii), (1)(B), (2), (3), (4), and (5) of section 10301 4 of Public Law 117–169 (commonly known as the "Infla-5 tion Reduction Act of 2022") as of the date of the enactment of this Act, \$14,300,000,000 are hereby rescinded. 6 (b) CLASSIFICATION OF BUDGETARY EFFECTS.-7 8 Notwithstanding Rule 3 of the Budget Scorekeeping 9 Guidelines set forth in the joint explanatory statement of 10 the committee of conference accompanying Conference Report 105-217 and section 250(c)(8) of the Balanced 11 12 Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, the 13 budgetary effects of this section shall not be estimated— 14 (1) for purposes of section 251 of such act; 15 (2) for purposes of an allocation to the Com-16 mittee on Appropriations pursuant to section 302(a)17 of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974; and 18 (3) for purposes of paragraph (4)(C) of section 19 3 of the Statutory Pay-As-You-Go Act of 2010 as 20 being included in an appropriation Act. 21 This Act may be cited as the "Israel Security Supple-22 mental Appropriations Act, 2024".
